

Climate Prediction Center's Central Asia Hazards Outlook For USAID / FEWS-NET November 26 – December 02, 2020

Temperatures:

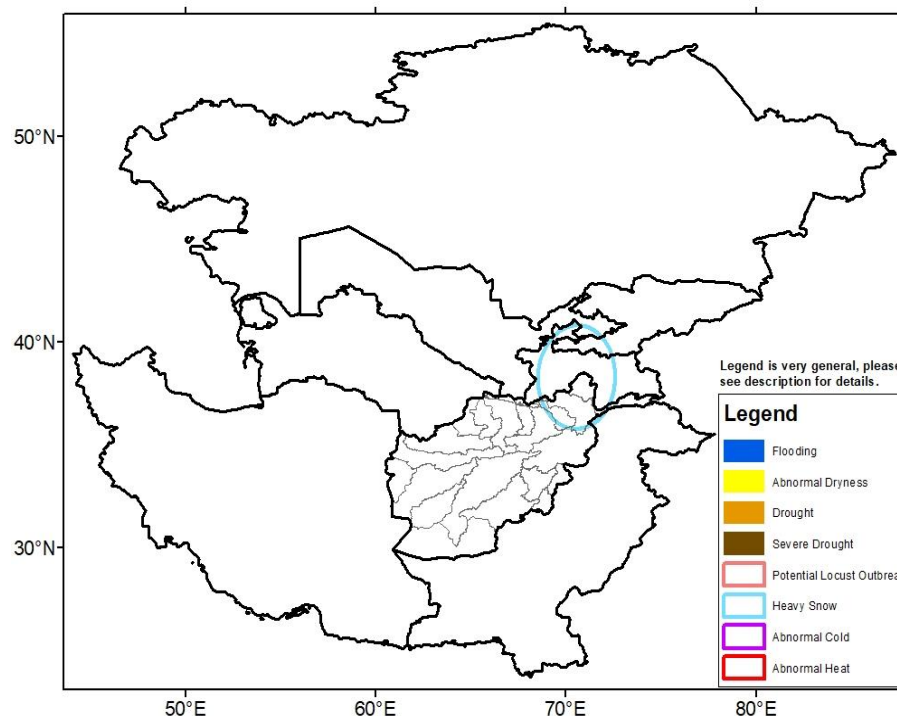
As expected, the end of November is marked by a significant decrease of temperature over the northern and eastern part of Central Asia. This past 7-days, the Kazakhstan has registered the lowest temperature in Central Asia. Subfreezing temperatures has been noticed over Tajikistan and small part of the far northern part of Afghanistan.

For the coming week, Tajikistan is expected to have the lowest temperature below -25°C. Kazakhstan, is expected to have from the north to the south respectively from -15° to near normal. Between -5°C to -15°C is expected over the central and northern part of Afghanistan, the northern part of Pakistan while the southern and southwestern part of Central Asia will still be remaining above average temperature.

Precipitation

This past 7 days, less rainfall than the previous week has been observed. Light to moderate rainfall has been recorded over the far eastern part of Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, the central and eastern part of Tajikistan, the northern part of Afghanistan and the northern part of Pakistan.

For the outlook period, heavy snowfall is expected over the far southwestern part of Kyrgyzstan, a major part of Tajikistan and a small portion of the northern part of Afghanistan.



Note: The Hazards outlook map is based on current weather/climate information, short and medium range weather forecasts (up to 1 week), and assesses their potential impact on crop and pasture conditions. Shaded polygons are added in areas where anomalous conditions have been observed. The boundaries of these polygons are only approximate at this continental scale.
