Haiti Weather Hazards and Benefits Assessment

September 14 – 20, 2006

Hispaniola has had a near normal first season. Although some rainfall deficits have accrued locally, regionally conditions remain near normal. These small deficits are the remnants of a few brief dry spells that occurred over various parts of the island. A tropical wave will make its way south of Hispaniola early in the period. This may bring locally heavy precipitation to the southern and eastern portions of the island.
